US denies Beijing's accusation

The White House on Monday denied Beijing's accusation that the United States has been sending balloons over China to conduct surveillance...

'Any claim that the US government operates surveillance balloons over the PRC is false,' National Security Council spokesperson Adrienne Watson said on Twitter.

'It is China that has a high-altitude surveillance balloon program for intelligence collection, that it has used to violate the sovereignty of the US and over 40 countries across 5 continents.'

The State Department responded with a similar rejection, and called Beijing's accusation 'the latest example of China scrambling to do damage control.'

Haley faces 'high-wire act' in 2024 bid against Trump

Few have navigated the turbulent politics of the Trump era like Nikki Haley.

In early 2016, the then-South Carolina governor said she was 'embarrassed' by candidate Donald Trump and decried his reluctance to condemn white supremacists.

And shortly after Trump left the White House, Haley, whose resume by then included an ambassadorship to the United Nations, vowed not to step in the way if he ran for the 2024 Republican presidential nomination.



Yet on Wednesday, she is poised to become the first major Republican candidate to enter the race against him.

'It's going to be quite the high-wire act,' said veteran Republican strategist Terry Sullivan. 'She says she's always been an underdog. She will be again.'

The 51-year-old Haley may be the first to take on Trump, but a half-dozen or more high-pro-

file Republicans are expected to join the GOP's 2024 presidential nomination contest over the coming months.

Likely rivals include Sen. Tim Scott, a fellow South Carolina and perhaps the most celebrated elected official in a state where Trump has already locked up endorsements from the governor and its senior senator, Lindsey Graham.

Indeed, on the eve of this week's announcement, there is broad agreement that Haley —

the only Republican woman of color expected in the 2024 contest, a politician who loves to remind people that she has never lost an election — is about to be tested as never before.

Trump has stepped up his attacks on Haley in recent weeks. But allies describe the former governor, who is the daughter of Indian immigrants, as a savvy executive uniquely positioned to lead a new generation of Republicans.

'She took the bull by the horns and said, 'That doesn't matter to me, I'm going to run,' said longtime supporter Gavin J. Smith. 'She did that when she ran for governor, and that's what you're going to see when she runs for president.'

After their genitals were cut, some women search for healing

She remembers it all: How female relatives held her down when she was 11, legs spread and genitals exposed. The fear that stiffened her body. The stranger in black holding the scissors. And the pain.



'I had a feeling of being incomplete and that I will never feel happy because of this,' she said. 'It's a horrible feeling.'

Like so many others, the 34-year-old Egyptian woman has lived with the psychological and physical repercussions of that day, when she was subjected to a practice many activists call 'mutilation.'

A global target aims to eradicate the deeply entrenched practice by 2030, and protect the next generations of girls, though campaigners acknowledge the difficulties in achieving that.

France: Its troops misrepresented in Wakanda Forever

France's defence minister has denounced the way he says French soldiers deployed in Africa appear to be depicted in the Marvel Studios superhero film 'Black Panther: Wakanda Forever' as 'false and misleading.'

Minister Sébastien Lecornu 'strongly condemned' the similarity of a fictional group of villainous mercenaries with French armed forces members, in a tweet published Sunday about the film that came out in November in France and the US.

Thousands march in Israel as Netanyahu allies push overhaul

Tens of thousands of Israelis — hoisting flags, blowing on horns and chanting 'democracy' and 'no to dictatorship' — protested outside the parliament building Monday as Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's government formally launched a contentious plan to overhaul the country's legal system.

It was the largest protest outside the Knesset in years and reflected the deep divisions over the plan. The proposed changes have triggered weeks of mass demonstrations, drawn cries of protests from influential business leaders and former military men and even prompted a statement of concern from President Joe Biden.



Netanyahu's allies approved a series of legislative changes during a stormy committee meeting Tuesday. The vote now sends the legislation to the full parliament for a series of votes — an opening salvo in a battle expected to stretch on for weeks.

'They hear our cry. They hear the strong voice of truth,' opposition leader Yair Lapid said from the stage outside parliament. 'They hear it and they're afraid.'

The protesters came from across the country. Organizers said that upwards of 100,000 people were in attendance, with female LGBTQ activists and leaders of the opposition parties addressing the crowd.

Thousands of people arrived in Jerusalem on packed trains, streaming up escalators in the city's main train station chanting, 'democracy,' cheering and whistling, and waving the national flag. Hundreds of others gathered in protest at Jerusalem's Western Wall, the holiest site where Jews can pray, before marching toward the Knesset.

Police in Pak arrest 75 over blasphemy killing

Over 75 suspects, including members of the radical Tehreek Laibbaik Pakistan (TLP) outfit, have been arrested for their alleged role in the lynching of a blasphemy-accused man in Punjab province of Pakistan, police said on Monday.

A violent mob on Saturday stormed the police station at Warburton in Nankana Sahib, some 80kms from Lahore, took custody of Waris Ali Issa, who was arrested for allegedly desecrating the holy book, stripped him naked, and dragged him into the streets before beating him to death.

An FIR has been registered against over 800 suspects for killing Waris, attacking police personnel, and ransacking the police station under terrorism and different sections of the Pakistan Penal Code.
